

Social conflict occurs when two or more actors oppose each other in social interaction, reciprocally exerting social power in an effort to attain scarce or incompatible goals and prevent the opponent from attaining them. Conflict school in Sociology focuses on tensions and conflicts which arise when status, resources and power are unevenly distributed between groups in and when conflicts become engine society change. Lewis Coser regards Social conflict as struggle over claims to status, power and scarce resources in which the aims of the conflict groups are not only to gain desired values, but also neutralise, injure or eliminate rivals. Social conflict encompasses a wide range of social phenomena like communal conflicts, riots, rebellions, strikes, revolutions, civil disorders, marches, demonstrations, protest gathering etc. Individual, community and institutional levels interventions contribute to positive adaptation to conflict. Resilience refers to a socioeconomic-political's response to violence and capacity to maintain peace resting the pernicious impacts of violence on societal norms and relationships. As instances of violence and social disruptions are manifesting in different ways across the globe, there is imminent need to study and explore the ways societies respond to conflict through adaptation, absorption and transformation. The conference aims to deliberate and discuss on the various manifestations of Conflict, Collective action and Resilience from Sociological perspective

- Armed conflicts and violence :Global, national and regional reactions and responses



GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

Paper presenters should send an Abstract in English (MS Word, Times New Roman, 12 pt., 1.5 space and should include the Title of the Paper, Name, Designation, University / College, Contact Number and Email ID of the presenter/s).

It should not exceed 250 words with keywords not more than three. Abstract of the papers should be sent to kssabstract2024@gmail.com. A Committee will scrutinize the abstracts and only the selected abstracts will be accepted for presentation. The criteria for scrutiny are: 1) Relevance of the paper to the theme, 2) Methodological application and 3) Theoretical and Conceptual clarity.

UG & PG students should forward their paper through HoD/deputed faculty member of the respective department for the purpose of ensuring the quality of the paper as well as relevance with the theme of the conference.
