Association with the Indian Sociological Society: I contributed to ISS by hosting the 36th and 43rd All India Sociological Conferences at Cuttack, Odisha (2010) and Lucknow, U.P. (2017), respectively, and the recent Mid-term ISS International Conference at Lucknow (April 2023) on the occasion of the centenary celebration of our Department. Despite the constraints of state Universities with limited resources, I tried to execute these challenging assignments to the best of my abilities. Indian Sociology has a distinguished history that needs retelling. Further contexts change and so do challenges. It is in this context that I have organized many conferences since 1993 on the practice of Indian sociology. These saw participation and contributions by scholars across the country and bore fruit in three edited books, namely, The Practice of Sociology; Sociology in India: Intellectual and Institutional Practices; and co-edited Doing Theory: Locations, Hierarchies and Disjuncture.

I have been an active collaborator in writing textbooks on sociology for the NCERT between 2005 and 2007.
